About Us

Under the leadership of Jurisdictional Prelate, Bishop Jerry L. Ivery Sr, the Kenya East Africa Jurisdiction (KEAJ) of the Church of God In Christ embraces advocacy to improve educational reformation, diminish global starvation, establish pecuniary stabilization and support ministry excellence within its assigned territory. In 2015, Dr. Valerie Daniels-Carter was installed as Jurisdictional Supervisor by Mother Willie Mae Rivers-General Supervisor (Emeritus), to lead the Kenyan Department of Women. Her charge is to advance, maintain and safeguard a solid spiritual and physical familial life, while constructing and pursuing the work of the Lord.

In support of the Churches of God In Christ, Bishop Ivery, KEAJ, Dr. Daniels-Carter and the Kenya East Africa Department of Women (KEADW) has a mission and vision which encompasses three Foundational Pillar Strategies:

1. Education and Training

- Develop Business Empowerment for Women
- 2. Ministry Initiatives and Evangelism
 - Aid and Enhance Orphanages and Ministries
- 3. Medical Assistance and Nutrition
 - Support Approved Medical Initiatives

The KEADW Mission is being carried out through several initiatives which include, but are not limited to a supporting the Joy Valley Orphanage and Shadow Mountain Children's Home, Medical Camps, Partnership with a local hospital, Women's Ministry and the development of Self-Sustainability Programs for these and other initiatives.

H&M EMPOWERMENT INITIATIVE

In October 2015, the H&M Empowerment Initiative was established. It is named after Pastor Hildah Kivuti & Pastor Mary Muriithi, whose passion mirrors the vision of Supervisor Carter and the KEADW. As part of the Self-Sustainability program, the initiative empowers the women of Kenya who have the capability, but lack adequate capital to launch a business to become self-sufficient. Selected women participate in a 3-Tier Process:

- 1) Education and training in entrepreneurship.
- 2) Funding for businesses in concentrated areas (Including raising farm animals, Horticulture, Soap Making, Bead work, Tent/Chair rental and growing.)
- 3) Loan Repayment Plan which includes reinvestment for expansion and funding for medical hospital.

The Initiative began with 18 women and was closely monitored by Pastor Hilda and Pastor Mary. As of January 2018, over 207 women are accomplished entrepreneurs'.

The H&M Empowerment Initiative has proven to be a model with the potential for global success.



JOY VALLEY ORPHANAGE

Joy Valley Orphanage cares for abandoned children to the fullest extent including schooling. KEADW determined an immediate need to provide 50 complete beds with mattresses & bedding, as well as a water tank for clean water. To facilitate improved living conditions, building materials were purchased to reconstruct the walls, windows, floor, roof, bathrooms, kitchen and dining area. Beginning November 2015, funding for annual Thanksgiving and Christmas Dinner is allocated for the children, along with clothes and gifts.

In 2017, as a part of the Self-Sustainability Program, KEADW funded the Joy Valley Orphanage for the purpose of farming and raising animals, beginning with 250 chicken, 30 pigs & 13 ducks. The program is achieving the goal of becoming self-sustaining, which includes paying teachers and staff a decent wage.



SHADOW MOUNTAIN CHILDREN'S HOME

In August 2016, KEADW began providing financial support to Shadow Mountain in Nairobi, Kenya. There are more than 75 children who are associated with this orphanage. Over 200 pairs of shoes, clothing and food have been distributed. In addition, an Annual Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner, along with gifts are given to the children.



MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

In the summer of 2015 and 2016, KEADW hosted a Medical Camp Day. The medical team which included physicians and other medical professionals conducted full examinations, provided medication and supplies to over 500 men, women and children. In addition, over 2,200 eye glasses were donated and distributed to families after eye examinations. This event included the sharing of the gospel, singing, food and gifts. Supervisor Carter personally funded the medical camp the first year!

MEDICAL HOSPITAL

In February 2016, KEADW donated the property and funded the construction of the first Church of God In Christ Medical Hospital in Bondo, Kenya. Designed with 10 rooms, waiting area, office space and restrooms, the hospital provides healthcare for children and area residents with non-acute illnesses. Dr. Florence Kiboi, Director of Maria Hospital, oversees the medical services including exams, lab & specimen testing and pharmaceutical needs, as well as ambulatory care. The hospital is staffed with a team of nurses and medical personnel, computers with medical software, medications and supplies. The hospital is completely funded by donations through KEADW fundraising initiatives and profits from the Self-Sustainability Program, as patients are uninsured

The official dedication was in August 2016 at which time it was named the "Bishop Jerry L. Ivery Sr. Medical Clinic" in honor of our Jurisdictional Prelate.







MARIA HOSPITAL PARTNERSHIP

KEADW and the COGIC Hospital has partnered with Dr. Florence Kiboi, Director of Maria Hospital, through continued financial and non-financial support. KEADW provided 22 computers, fully loaded with medical software and major medical equipment in April 2017. As a result, patient records are more efficient allowing for better medical care. In April 2018, KEADW purchased 20 hospital beds. The partnership has proven to be positive.
